



Earth gets ( 1 ) from the sun. Some of the heat escapes into space, but some is trapped*
by a blanket of gases. This keeps Earth warm enough ( 2 ) us to live here, and it's called
the greenhouse* effect ( 3 ) it works like a greenhouse.
When we use fossil fuels* we make a ( 4 ) called carbon dioxide*. Scientists think that
we are putting too much carbon dioxide into the air. The carbon dioxide increases the
greenhouse effect and Earth gets ( 5 ). This is called global warming.
Scientists think that global warming is changing our climate* and making the ( 6 ) more
extreme. This is a problem for people, animals, and plants. Hurricanes are getting more
dangerous. In 2005, a huge hurricane hit New Orleans in the USA. About 2,000 people died,
and most of the city ( $$ 7 $$ ) flooded. There are many rivers in Bangladesh. There are always
floods in the rainy season, but the floods are getting worse. Every year, some people die and
thousands of people lose their homes. In the Sahara Desert in Africa, there is not enough rain
and the desert is getting bigger. People have left their homes because they can't grow food.
The Gobi Desert in China and Mongolia is also getting ( 8 ). Desert sand blows all the
way into cities in North Korea and South Korea.
